

## **Peripatetic Music Lessons**

Thank you for your responses to the peripatetic music lesson forms. We were inundated with children wanting to take up instruments. We will be providing violin, guitar and keyboard lessons next year. We will initially offer these lessons to pupils in Year 5 and Year 6 as demand was so high. We will hold waiting lists of pupils in Year 3 and 4 if we can't offer a place straight away. The cost to parents will be £5 a week and is subsidised by the school. A sign up letter will be sent out in the first few weeks back and places will be offered on a first come first served basis. If any child wants to learn an instrument but would struggle financially to pay please contact the office for a confidential chat.

## PE Kit

At the end of this term all PE kits will be sent home. From the start of next term, when we return from the Easter holidays, children will come to school wearing their PE kit rather than getting changed in school. This will ensure that the children can be ready immediately to start their PE lesson and that they don't need to get changed in school. For September 2024 a consultation will go out in regard to PE kit and how we can adapt the current policy to make it cheaper and easier for parents.

#### Wrap around Care

Our wraparound service will be going ahead from September 2024. The provision will start at 7.30am cost for breakfast club will be £6. This includes the childcare, activities and food. The after school provision will run until 6pm and will be £9 a session. This will also include childcare, activities and food. At the start of the summer term parents will be invited to

sign up for the service and the terms and conditions will be sent out. Free places at any of the clubs will only be offered at the school's discretion as the service needs to be able to pay for itself.

#### **Current Breakfast Club**

Please be aware that you MUST book a session in Breakfast Club. This is for Health and safety and legal ratio purposes. If you haven't booked a session I am afraid you can't send your child to the club. It is also very important that you drop your child at the door to be marked in. Pupils can't just be dropped in the yard and left. If a child is just left to attend Breakfast club alone without being registered parents will be contacted to collect their child and will no longer be able to use the service. Not handing your child over to a member of staff is a safeguarding issue as until this is undertaken parents are still fully responsible for the safety and welfare of their child. Can we also ask parents to cancel any places they do not want to take the day before. Failure to cancel sessions means other children can't attend and we will have to prevent further bookings.

#### Mother and toddler group

Our Mother and Toddler group is held in the school hall every Wednesday from **9am to 11.15am.** We would love to see you there. Please enter through the main office entrance so that we can sign you in. There is no cost to attend and we would love to see lots of our little ones there. Refreshments will be available.

#### **Attendance Stars**

The school are starting a new system to improve attendance across school. This is called attendance stars. For every full day your child is in school they will receive a star. These stars can then be used at the end of the term to buy prizes in our attendance star shop. There will be prizes and certificates also for children with the most improved attendance as well as excellent attendance. Whole class special prizes will also be awarded for the best class each term.

#### **After School Clubs**

Spring Term After school clubs have now finished. There will be **NO** After school clubs on next week except for the Karate Grading being on Wednesday at 3.30pm.

#### **Reading Plus**

The school has purchased Reading Plus. Reading plus is an online reading programme that's packed full of engaging texts for pupils to explore and enjoy. It teaches silent reading fluency, comprehension, and vocabulary with software that meets each pupil's individual reading level. This is an online programme and over the coming weeks pupils will be given a username and password so they can access this at home.

#### Packed Lunches

St Joseph's is a healthy school. If your child brings in a packed lunch, we ask parents to provide a healthy packed lunch containing:

- sandwich
- fruit
- a biscuit
- drink

Please do not send fizzy drinks, sweets or chocolate (including chocolate covered biscuits and cakes). Takeaway food items are not permitted.

#### Paying for school meals in Year 3,4,5 and 6

As you may be aware, school meals are universally free to all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. From Year 3 onwards, if you would like your child to have a school meal there is a cost of £2.75. Some families in these year groups are still entitled to free means tested school meals by filling in an application form if in receipt of certain benefits. If you think this may be you and your child is not receiving school meals for free, please contact the school office.

#### **Arbor and Weduc**

I am aware from speaking to a few parents on the Curriculum Evening that there has been some confusion around the apps that the school uses. Arbor is currently used in school for payments, booking breakfast club/after school clubs and meals. Weduc is currently used for letters we send home. In the near future, the school will be moving across to Arbor for everything to try and simplify this for parents. More details will follow when this is going to occur. #### School Meals

We have attached the school meal menu for this academic year to this newsletter. We encourage all parents to pre book their child's meals via Arbor and pay (where applicable). Pre booking meals allows more time in the morning to be spent on learning and teaching.

#### **Breakfast Club**

Please pre-book and pay for your places for breakfast club on Arbor. The capacity for the club is 30. Once this number is reached the school can't accept drop-ins.

#### Names in Clothes

Please remember to put your children's names in their clothing. We appreciate how costly it can be to buy uniform, especially if you have more than one child, and we really want to support the children in looking after their own things. Without names, things can get lost and we don't want you to have replace lost items.

#### Play equipment

May I remind parent's that children are not allowed on the play equipment before and after school. This is a Health and Safety directive as it must be supervised by trained staff. All equipment is being reopened for the children so they will be getting lots of opportunities to play on it throughout the school day.

## Parental discussions with teachers

We really value close communication with our parents as it is key to ensuring we achieve the best for all of our pupils. To ensure our staff can give you the full attention for any concerns and issues that you may have, we ask that if you need to speak to the class teacher about anything that will take more that a few minutes that you make an appointment with them. This can be done through the school office. This is to make sure classes aren't left unattended and that staff can really give you the time you deserve so we can fully support the children.

### **UNIFORM**

We would like to remind all parents and carers of the expected uniform in school. Children can wear grey trousers, grey smart uniform shorts, grey skirt, royal blue sweatshirt, yellow polo shirt, blue gingham school dresses. All uniform can be with or **without** the school logo. If children currently have black trousers or skirts they can still be worn. We ask that when new uniform is purchased that all skirts, shorts and trousers are grey. Children should not be wearing sports leggings/sports shorts, joggers, hair extensions ,earrings, trainers or false nails for school. No extreme hair styles including tram lines.
